



Excerpt from the UIB Academic Regulations about academic integrity.

10959. REGULATORY AGREEMENT of March 18th 2014 approving the Academic regulations of the University.

Article 33. Fraud

1. Regardless of any disciplinary proceedings that may be taken against the offending student, proven cases of the use of fraudulent means to carry out any of the assessment activities included in the teaching guides of a subject will, at the lecturer's discretion, result in a reduction of the student's mark, which may include a grade of "fail" (0) for the annual assessment of the subject.

2. In particular, the following are considered as fraud:

- a) In written examinations or tests, the use of any means intended to provide the answers.
- b) In individual or group assignments and practical sessions, including fragments of other people's works in such a way as to give the impression they are one's own (plagiarism).

3. If the student believes the decision is wrong, he or she can appeal against the grade received following the procedure set out in Articles 37 and 38 of this regulation.
